

LEARNING TRADE SECRETS WORKSHOPS

Bow Rehairing & Maintenance Workshop

May 20-25, 2018

Suggested Enrollment Cap: 15

COURSE INFORMATION

Course Description: Students interested in learning how to rehair and maintain bows for stringed instruments will find this hands on course very thorough and challenging. This course is for those with little to no tool skills. By the end of the week, students will have learned how to handle a knife, chisel and other tools of the trade along with a consistent method for rehairing bows. Demonstrations will show students other maintenance techniques useful for employment in the industry.

Course Objective: The student will learn how to properly prepare and rehair a violin bow by first disassembling the bow and then polishing parts, cutting plugs and installing hair. The student will be encouraged to rehair three bows during the week and more time permitting.

Course Topics: Course topics will include preparing bows of varying materials, including carbon fiber, wood and fiberglass; and how different types of hair affect sound production. Also discussions on gauging the proper amount of hair, pleasing clients, and how camber and straightening affect a rehair. There also will be additional demonstrations on replacing wraps and thumbgrips. All questions will be answered.

RESOURCES AND SUPPLEMENTARY MATERIALS

Materials: A photo essay is provided to each student as a visual reference for assistance during the workshop. Additional written materials are available for the student's purposes only and are not for resale.

Tools: Tools are expensive and take knowledge to prepare and maintain. Students are encouraged to bring their own, however a tool box is provided with tools ready for use during the week. All tools must be returned prior to leaving the workshop.
