

# LEARNING TRADE SECRETS WORKSHOPS

## Frog & Button Making

May 23-29, 2021

Suggested Enrollment Cap: 9

### Course Information

**Course Description:** This course will demonstrate classic French frog construction. The method uses a minimal number of hand tools. Construction of a violin and cello frog, and a button will be demonstrated over the week. The emphasis will be on a system and order of work using traditional hand tools and gouges. The work will be demonstrated in the morning with afternoons and evenings for students to work, with the instructor available for questions.

**Course Objective:** The course objective is to understand and replicate the method and order of work for making a frog and button, however, tool skill will determine how much is accomplished during the week.

**Pre-requisite:** There are no pre-requisites for this course, however, an understanding of bow construction and tool skills is necessary, so do your homework.

**Course Topics:** The following topics will be discussed during the week:

- Basic frog & button measurements
- Wood choice and grain alignment
- Design and shaping
- Soldering metals
- Polishing

### Materials & Tools

**Materials:** Materials will be supplied for one frog, including wood, pearl, silver, a pre-made ferrule for those without soldering skills, screws and eyelets.

**Tools:** Some tools are available for use during class\*\*, however, you must bring your own knives, block plane, gouge, and files. Don't feel like you have to buy everything listed, just bring basic tools listed above.

- In-cannel gouge of approximately #5 sweep (Diefenbacher - item #500-1126)
- Knives
- Block plane
- Grobet hand files 8" #00, #2, #4 (Otto Frei - item #131.140)
- 1/2 round needle files #00, #2 (Otto Frei - item #131.516)
- Small engineers square\*\* (MSC - item #79267936 or Dictum Tools - item #707274)
- Small adjustable bevel square (Amazon - 4.5" adjustable bevel)
- 6" caliper, the cheap digital from Harbor Freight is fine\*\* (Harbor Freight item #61585)
- Jewelers saw with #2/0 blade for pearl and silver (Rio Grande German Saw - item #110039)
- and a coarser wood cutting blade\*\* (Kit Assortment with saw and lube - item #110328)
- #63 twist drill bit for pins\*\* (MSC - item #78520012 minimum order of 12)
